Muscular Dystrophy (MD) participants were ages 6 to 17, male & female. Functional impairments ranged from 1 through 3 (0 = no impairment, 4 = complete impairment), about half in wheelchairs. Objectives are detailed in the link. Facility is "challenge by choice" and most activities did NOT have 100% participation throughout the week, except our program DID have 100% participation.

Trained 5 other volunteers, including TR methodologies, including APIED, I supervised and trained them between February to July 18th & 20th, to prepare for this event over a 6 month period to aide in implementing these programs for 21 campers with Muscular Dystrophy, plus their individual "helpers" and the dozen camp counselors.

Despite the potentially high risk with this population during the live-action combat LARP, there were zero injuries, no visits to the infirmary or nurses. Outlined objectives achieved and exceeded everyone's expectations. Continuing to attend MDA community monthly meetings, and provide occasional activities.
